# GRANADA HOTEL & BISTRO

**T**he Granada Hotel & Bistro is perfect for a romantic getaway any time of year. However, the 17-room property is the physical embodiment of a Central Coast autumn, with its exposed brick walls, hand-crafted steel windows, wrought iron balconies, Persian rugs, supple leather headboards, and original hardwood floors. The scene is set for romance and relaxation. It all makes sense, as former Hollywood screenwriter Kimberly Walker channeled her experience to become the visionary founder and managing partner of this and other hotels in the Nomada Hotel Group.

The brick walls and carefully curated furnishings make bedrooms and suites like this the ultimate place to wind down on a crisp fall evening.

Like other Nomada properties, the Granada was brought back to life through a complete renovation and restoration of a once-utilitarian Central Coast building. At one point, Walker used some of the office space in this 1920s structure for her original Granada Bistro wine bar. Although her first foray into the hospitality world was successful, her landlord lost ownership of the building. The setback, however, was a catalyst for a bigger vision as she and several other entrepreneurs came together at Burning Man to form the “Lunacy Club” to take things to the next level. As she would with her future hotels, Walker found inspiration in her world travels, including

philanthropic work focused on women’s issues in Arusha, Tanzania.

Walker (also an inventor, creating ‘Wine Wipes,’ to remove wine stains on teeth, and later, The Vanity Project, a collection of single-use amenities for modern travelers) managed the renovation, incorporating distinctive objects and furnishings she collected through the years. While the original structure would speak volumes if the walls could talk, so do the various spaces throughout the property. A private hotel guest lounge feels a lot like a private home (or one you wish you owned in San Luis Obispo) with its fireplace

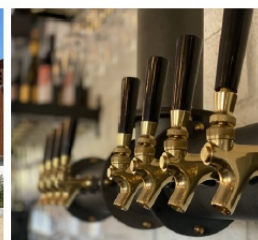

comfortable seating, artwork  
by photographer Barry  
Goyette, and an impressive  
selection of classy coffee table  
books.

All of the suites and guest  
rooms begin with a canvas of  
exposed brick walls, hand-  
crafted steel windows, Persian  
rugs and original hardwood  
floors. Finishing touches  
include opulent marble and  
tiled bathrooms, nickel-plated  
fixtures, towels and linen  
by Fili d'Oro, goose down  
duvet and pillows, signature

seersucker robes, a carefully  
curated in-room mini bar,  
and original art intended  
to set the mood. The hotel's  
heart and soul, meanwhile,  
The Granada Bistro, is  
conceptually expanded into  
a chic French bistro with  
infusions of Spanish flavors  
that showcase a collection  
of local wines and classic  
cocktails.

Granada Bistro, steered  
by Executive Chef Kenny  
Bigwood, is known for the  
way French bistro concepts  
are translated into exciting

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new creations with modern techniques and bold California flavors. The wine program touches on many growing regions around the world. Nightcap, the hotel's exclusive cocktail lounge, is noted for inventive crafted cocktails, bites, and sipping spirits. Hotel guests receive convenient access to the lounge throughout their entire stay.

If this wasn't festive enough, the hotel will be offering thoughtfully curated cocktail kits with top shelf ingredients for the more intimate festivities at the hotel or on the wine trails. There is also an events program ([events@granadahotelandbistro.com](mailto:events@granadahotelandbistro.com)) where one can book small private cocktail mixers, luncheons or dinners on the rooftop terrace or inside the Bistro. There is also a compact spa with a small but lovely spread of services

(from Swedish massages to ayurvedic body treatments). Other luxe guest amenities include complimentary electric Linus bikes for guests to explore charming downtown San Luis Obispo, local wineries and miles of surrounding bike trails. The retail and wine shop features a distinctive selection of home and fashion items by local artisans and specialty finds from around the world. Signature lunch items are available to order Monday through Friday to enjoy at the hotel's patio or on a wine country sojourn.
